EVERY CONSERVATION DISTRICT CONTRIBUTES TO ORCA RECOVERY






Basins that are home to priority Chinook stocks for Southern Resident killer whales stretch across our state. Several Washington State Conservation Commission (SCC) programs support salmon recovery projects in these basins, and every conservation district completes work that benefits salmon.

Example: Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program (CREP) - Good for Salmon, Good for Orca

- ► CREP is an incentive-based program that has helped farmers voluntarily restore habitat along hundreds of miles of salmon-bearing streams in Washington.
- ▶ Nearly all stream segments eligible for CREP are in basins that are home to priority Chinook stocks for Southern Resident killer whales.
- ▶ In watersheds with high levels of participation in CREP, Chinook returns have increased, and water temperatures have cooled.

CREP is cooperatively administered by the SCC, USDA Farm Service Agency, and conservation districts.
